June 10 – Choices and Consequences

1 Samuel 8:4-11, (12-15), 16-20, (11:14-15)

“No, we are determined to have a king over us, so that we also may be like other nations...”
Sometimes we want something – even when we’ve been told it is not good for us – so that we can be like others. That can be true for us as individuals, churches, communities, or nations. And sometimes it can get us into trouble. Think of situations in history where this has happened. When have you wanted something so that you can be like others? What were some of the consequences? Write about it your journal. This week, consider ways and times you look to God’s leading.

June 17 – God’s Role for Me

1 Samuel 15:34-16:13

“The Lord does not see how mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart.” Often, we can be quick to judge others based on appearance, or on how they present themselves. Reflect on times when you met someone and made assumptions about them based on how they sounded or dressed, and had your assumptions proven wrong. How does it feel when this happens? This week, try to look beyond appearances and into people’s hearts.

June 24 – Agents of God

1 Samuel 17:(1a, 4-11, 19-23), 32-49

“You come to me with sword and spear and javelin; but I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the people of Israel, whom you have defied.”
Others can come toward us with all sorts of weapons – literally and figuratively. We can feel threatened and attacked. And we may feel like we are defenseless. The scripture reminds us that we need not respond in kind, but rather can use our awareness of God’s presence in our lives, and the examples of Jesus, to respond not with violence but with compassion and understanding. Reflect on times when you have felt confronted by something insurmountable. How did you respond? This week, imagine ways you will use the gifts of God to diffuse a difficult situation.

July 1 – Brushing Up against Grace

Mark 5:21-43

“Do not fear, only believe.”
Jesus seeks to heal, despite any and all odds. He insists on discovering who touched his robe, not to scold her but to commend her faith. Jesus continues to the home of the synagogue leader’s family, despite having been told it is pointless because the child is dead. We are reminded of the need to press on with our work, even when things seem stacked against us. This week, reflect on a time when you have felt discouraged in something you wanted to do in response to God’s call. How did you carry on, or how could you carry on? Write about it in your journal.

NEW in worship this morning - Prayerful Coloring

You will find a small package of crayons and a half-sheet of paper with a line drawing of a mandala on it. Many people engage more fully through movement and action. People of faith through out the ages have walked labyrinths and created mandalas. Give it a try. Color while you worship. Color while you listen. See if this works for you. Benefits of prayerful coloring
For those who engage with prayerful colorings in our worship, the benefits are threefold:
1. Focusing The practice helps people focus on what is taking place around them, particularly during the message or sermon, particularly when attention span of many people wanes after five minutes or so. Many adults have approached me after worship, having done prayerful coloring for the first time, to say with great delight, “That is the first time I have sat through a sermon and heard every word!”
2. Mindfulness Through the simple, repetitive action of coloring in, people are brought into the conscious moment, mindful of space and place.
3. Centering prayer This prayer involves sight, mind, and body. Using a drawing based on scripture that is the focus of the worship service, integrated prayerful connections are made that may not otherwise be made.
