February 10 - Luke 5:1-11



"[Jesus] said to Simon 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch'" (Luke 5:4).

Jesus wants to show Simon Peter, James, and John what he is doing in a way they can understand. So, Jesus instructs his fishing friends to put their nets out into deep waters and draw fish into their boat. They are amazed at the catch. Jesus says,

"Do not be afraid, from now on you will be catching people." God's net of love goes deep and we are invited to join in a ministry of inclusive love.

February 17 - Luke 6:17-26

"[Jesus] came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon" (Luke 6:17).

Imagine a world that Jesus is talking about. It's a world of generosity, love, life, and compassion. Those are things people who are hungry, poor, and sad understand and long for. They're ready and waiting for God's world, or reign, to come – and they'll welcome it with joy when it does! People who live in ways that make life good for themselves but hard for others don't have much space for generosity, love, life, and compassion. That this kind of world will come is a very hard message for them to hear. No wonder Jesus says they are going to weep.

February 24 - Luke 6:27-38

"But I say to you that listen, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you" (Luke 6:27).

Jesus makes a controversial claim about how to treat those who believe and act differently: Love your enemies. Sustain all regardless of your judgment of them as good or bad. Be merciful because God is merciful. Here, Jesus turns our focus from an obsession with perfection to a posture of compassion.

March 3
 Luke 9:28-36, (37-43)

"Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw [Jesus'] glory and the two men who stood with him" (Luke 9:32).

How often we can miss something wonderful going on because we fall asleep, or we get caught up in the midst of something else. Peter, James, and John almost miss out on seeing Jesus in the presence of Moses and Elijah. Yet they do not miss this and, as a result, are invited to ponder Jesus in the light of some great forerunners of the faith, and to consider what the ministry of Jesus might be about. When have you almost missed out on something wonderful?
